What is GATE?

- ***** GATE represents **G**ifted **A**nd **T**alented **E**ducation.
- * The term *gifted* refers to children who show, or have the potential for showing, an exceptional level of performance in one or more areas of expression.
- GATE is the differentiated and specialized education within the classroom designed for these gifted children.
- GATE identification enables teachers to recognize and meet the unique needs of gifted students early on and throughout the school year.
- Students retain GATE status throughout their entire experience in the San Ramon Valley Unified School District.

Responsibilities

Purpose of GATE in the San Ramon Valley Unified School district (SRVUSD)

- Support excellence in the district through a program that enhances the education of ALL students while addressing the specific needs of the gifted.
- Provide GATE students with planned and organized learning experiences that are integrated into the regular school day.
- Ensure continuous academic growth with an equitable identification process, differentiated instruction, and enrichment in the classroom.

Goals for GATE in the SRVUSD

- 1. **Appropriate Pace:** Is the child moving through the curriculum at a pace that ensures continuous progress?
- 2. **Depth of Thinking and Instruction:** Does the curriculum allow the gifted child to go deeper than the surface of the subject area?
- 3. **Complexity:** Is the gifted child challenged by critical thinking and higher order thinking skills in the classroom?
- 4. **Product:** Does the child have the opportunity to be creative and then apply knowledge to real life situations?
